You'll complete business core and elective courses entirely online, while taking accounting courses in-person on Wednesday evenings on the DMACC-Urban campus. The program can be completed in just two years with four, full-time semesters (12-13 credits per semester) and two summers (one course each summer). A part-time option is also available.
