Courses & Delivery

Courses are offered entirely online through Zoom and Blackboard—dynamic platforms designed to enhance your learning experience and foster a sense of community with fellow classmates. Classes are delivered primarily asynchronously, with some synchronous meeting times required. Full-time students typically take four courses per semester, allowing them to complete the program in approximately two years.

Throughout the program, you'll learn from the same dedicated, expert faculty who teach on the UNI campus. Coursework covers a range of topics, including:
