NOTES: The AAS degree will transfer into this degree program as a "block" of credits (60-65 total credits). The only General Education transfer courses that may be transferred in are Composition, Speech/Oral, and Math. That will then determine how many, if any, electives a student will take. All students will take 60 credits through UNI coursework. No additional coursework beyond 60 credits will be required for any student. No student will take fewer than 60 credits of UNI coursework.

Ideally, a student will complete a composition course (any writing course), a communication (speech, oral communication, etc.), and a math (any math) class within their AAS degree. But in the case that a student may need to take one, two, or all three of those courses through UNI coursework, then they will take those courses instead of any electives. All remaining General Education requirements are included in the BAS degree program requirements and will be taken through UNI coursework.

All passing grades (D- and higher) will be accepted through transfer coursework, as long as all other University and BAS degree program admission requirements are met.
